Message from Sensei:

BAMBOO CHILDREN The World of Truths

The other day, I was having lunch with the other priests and an American member of Zenshuji during a work break. We were all having a Japanese style box lunch ordered from outside. While eating our lunches, one of the members asked: "What is this?" pointing to one strange looking thing in her own lunch. "Oh," said one of the priests, "those are bamboo children." The questioner looked rather surprised. As for myself, the image of this lady munching on little children for lunch immediately leaped to my mind and shocked me as well as made me laugh out loud.

I quickly explained the situation to her. She was eating a boiled bamboo shoot which in Japanese is called, "takenoko." This literally means "bamboo children" in Japanese but it is proper to say "bamboo shoot" in English.

This incident was very interesting to me and made me think. The Japanese priest was perfectly right in his explanation. For him, it is the truth and we cannot say that he is wrong in his answer. However, for that particular situation, that particular truth does not work and does not resolve the situation. Indeed, it leads to a kind of misunderstanding and kind of funny situation.

We spend most of our lives trying to figure out what is "Truth." We believe that understanding "Truth" or "truth" in general will bring meaning to our lives. At the same time, what we decide is "not the truth" we quickly label as "false" or "untrue." As we search for the "Truth," I think we also struggle greatly between what we believe is "true" and what we decide is "false."

In order to see "Truth," we have to be able to see it from an infinite number of sides at the same time. I think it is most difficult for us as human beings. I think that what most of us think is "true" is simply a matter of personal convenience or personal inclination. Ultimately, we make our own truths to fit or justify our own

needs and situation.

Another person's truth may appear as false to ourselves. And, at the same time, what we believe to be true may appear as a falsehood to someone else. As we all know, it is futile to argue who is right (although this seems to be a popular pasttime for mankind throughout the ages.) We see it in politics, economics and religion as well.

In Aikido, there is no shape to Truth. According to O-Sensei, it is constantly changing and evolving. We must understand Truth from one moment to the next. But, according to him, Truth has a kind of order and this is what he refers to as God.

As we create our own world, perhaps we must create our own truths. Probably what decides truth for ourselves is whether it is out of self-centered, personal convenience or out of our sincere faith and conviction. In our Aikido practice, I see many people who become confused as to what is responsibility and what is selfishness. When we can establish and clearly see our own beliefs and live by them from day to day, moment to moment, I believe that we have finally come to understand what is "Truth."

Through our Aikido training, we begin to see ourselves very well. One the mats, we can clearly see what we can do and cannot do. We can clearly see our own failings and where we excell. At the same time, we see how we are so connected with everyone else.

I hope everyone continues to practice hard and understands that we progress only when everyone around us progress. When we practice, we are truly practicing when everyone else is practicing together. When we are cleaning, we are truly cleaning when everyone is working together and cleaning together as well.

I see many people naturally taking on more responsibility and more duties in the dojo. Perhaps, I have become more lazy, I don't know. Maybe I am getting older. But to see everyone working together in harmony and taking on duties for themselves for everyone's benefit is a beautiful thing to see for me. Thank you very much. Indeed, I believe this is true Aikido practice.

UNIFORMS



NEW SOTO ZEN JOURNAL


